CONNECT your fish wishes with songs that describe hopes or wishful feelings. Can you think of songs that promote hope for a clean environment, strong relationships, or being appreciated? What songs pertain to the wishes you wrote?



CREATE a *Fish Wish* song. Hum a tune you already know, or create a catchy rhythm. Repeat it in your mind as words that fit your wish start to fall into place. Songwriters often play with descriptive words and words that form images in listeners minds. Rearrange your thoughts as words in one note and as the images those words represent in the other note, until you have a first draft of the song.

PRESENT your song ideas and images to a group of classmates and work together to refine the song. Repeat the process for each team member. When your team feels that the *Fish Wish* songs are ready, sing them to the class.
