


















































BAT CAVE CRAFT





This little craft shows how bats can hang upside down. All you need are cups and popsicle sticks. I cut out the front of the cup so that it looked like a cave. I found these cups at Wal-mart.


Students cut out the bat and the "bats hang upside down" tag. They glue the bat to one end of the popsicle stick and push the popsicle stick through a hole that is precut in the bottom of the cup. Then they glue the "bats hang upside down" tag to the other end of the popsicle stick. Simple as that. They can now move the bat up and down in the cave.

If you are completing this activity with young students, you may want to have the cups pre-cut with the front "cave" opening already cut and the slit on top for the popsicle stick pre-cut.










