Include scenes that show or describe the setting or plot.

Write a narrative inspired by the images. Consider the kindness you will include in a story that has a connected beginning, middle, and end.

Rearrange the illustrated notes into a different pattern and include other images so they form a new story based on the way those images now fit together. Discuss how shuffling the images and arranging them into a different flow impacts the story.



PRESENT your written and illustrated stories to the full class. Demonstrate how arranging the images in different ways can be springboards for different stories and how rearranging images created a new story flow. Discuss the kindness connections found in the artwork and narratives.
